Project Imo's mission is to provide immersive experiential and adventure education programs that help youth and communities develop relationships, provide access to nature to under-resourced communities, and spark environmental conservation.



The vision of the staff at Project Imo sees empowered, sustainable, diverse, and equitable communities connected with the environment where youth and the natural world are included as members with leadership voice.



Welcome to our Project Imo village. We're glad you are on this journey alongside of us. In what has been our first full year of operations, Project Imo has engaged in outdoor programming with nearly 100 youth from two schools and a youth program. We also worked virtually with homeschool youth across 3 countries. The number of dedicated volunteers willing to share their expertise and passion has grown nearly 200%. Our organizational capacity from programming revenue, donations, and grants has grown an astonishing 672%.

Without the support of generous donors and partners, the team at Project Imo would not have been able to engage youth in nature programs that focused on socialemotional learning, leadership skills, nature education, and STEAM-focused learning outcomes. Likewise, the effort to host 3 community trainings in medical emergencies and wilderness survival and leadership skills would have been impossible. Throughout 2021, our growing team of volunteers gave of their time and energy not only to run programs, but to engage in professional development. These workshops in trip and program leadership, adventure education programming, emergency medical interventions, risk management practices, and a trauma-informed approach to adventure facilitation were essential for serving our communities.

2021 has been an incredible year. Project Imo was idea that started within a small group of creators in 2020 amidst the backdrop of uncertainty within a global pandemic. It has grown exponentially into a recognized 501(c)(3) charitable educational organization in just a short time. This achievement came with the help of Pro Bono Partnership, a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization providing free business and transactional legal assistance to other nonprofits like Project Imo.

2021 concluded with tremendous support from our village through our Giving Tuesday fundraiser that grew our capacity by over \$4,000.00 to an annual total approaching \$8,000 of donated funds. The team at Project Imo also secured a technology grant from Microsoft for Nonprofits that could provide over \$130,000 worth of software access and data storage over a ten-year span.












VOLUNTEERS






